

Lexiophiles and bab.la publish results of the Top 100 International Exchange and Experience Blogs competition



(Hamburg, January 28, 2011) The Lexiophiles language blog and the bab.la language portal have published the results of the 2011 International Exchange and Experience Blog Competition, also known as IX11. The list features the top 100 blogs on living abroad.

This year's best worldwide blogs about the experiences abroad were chosen out of a pool of 220 nominations submitted by Lexiophiles readers and bab.la users, topping last year's record of 170 nominated blogs. The final top 100 ranking was based on user votes, attracting over 5.000 voters.

The top 3 blogs – 'Rok we Włoszech', 'Um Brasileiro na terra do Tio Sam' and 'Malou gaat naar Verenigde Staten voor een verre reis' – are great examples of the joys, difficulties and adventures of spending time exploring a foreign country. In 'Rok we Włoszech' a young Polish student couple shares their life and travel experiences in Italy. The No. 2 blog written by a Brazilian aims at helping other exchange students to find reliable information on living abroad.

"This year we also took a view from the other side, including blogs of host families sharing their experience with foreign visitors." says Valerie Jordan, project manager for Lexiophiles. "Reading the stories we could literally feel the ups and downs of culture clashes, creating awkward, funny and sometimes embarrassing situations." She concludes: "One blogger described her year abroad as a true roller-coaster ride: Scary and fun but in the end she would jump on the roller coaster any time again."
